

ADVERTISEMENT FOR BIDS

Sealed bid proposals will be received from qualified bidders until 3:00 pm on Wednesday, July 30th, 2014 by Robin James, Purchasing Agent of Chatham County, North Carolina for the Chatham County Environmental Quality Headquarters Project, in Pittsboro, North Carolina.

The Bid Opening will be held in the lower level auditorium room of the Chatham County Extension Office at 65 East Chatham Street, Pittsboro, N.C. At that time and place bids will be opened and read. A mandatory Pre-Bid Meeting for General Contractors will be held at the site on Thursday, July 17th, 2014 at 2:00 p.m. The address of the site is 720 Renaissance Drive, Pittsboro, N.C. 27312.

Mailed or hand delivered bids prior to the bid date must be labeled to reflect the Chatham County Environmental Quality Headquarters Project Bid and must be addressed to:

The project includes the new construction with site improvements of $\pm 5,000$ SF building, which includes new walls, new finishes, new plumbing/mechanical/electrical systems, and new millwork. Construction materials include brick masonry, concrete slab on grade, steel studs, metal wall panels, gypsum wallboard, carpet, vinyl tile, etc. Exterior improvements include new grading, site utilities, parking areas, etc. The existing modular office on site must remain in operation during construction until Chatham County staff can be relocated to the new building.

The Bid will be for General Construction Single Prime Bids only.
