

2020 Early and Election Day Voting-Chatham County Agriculture and Conference Center Directions to Campaigners

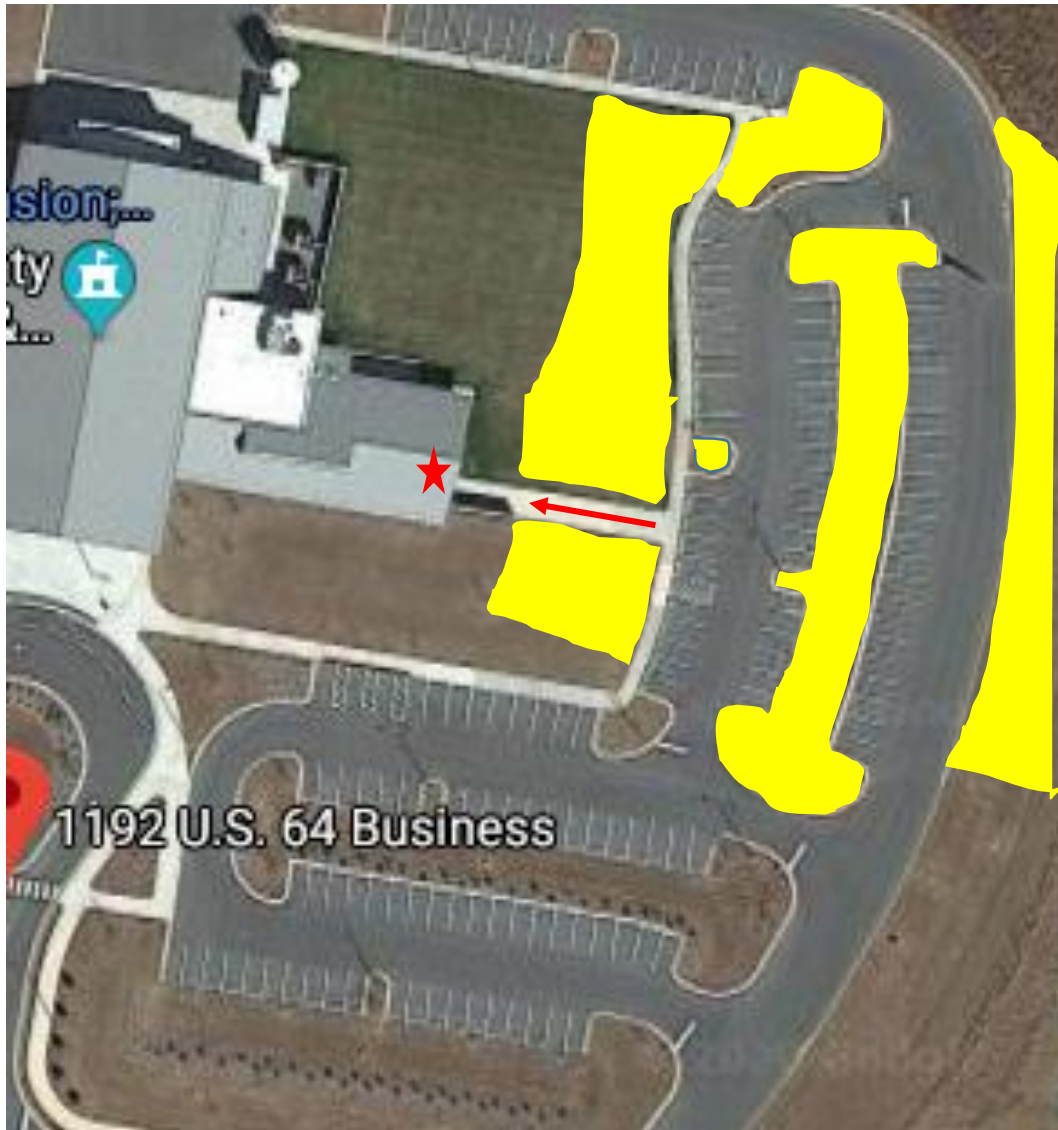


1. Curbside Voting/Handicap Parking

4. Campaigner restroom facilities

Please note:

- Several events are scheduled at the conference center during early voting and on election day. Please exercise caution when moving about the parking lot where cars may be in motion.
- Chatham County has a tobacco-free grounds ordinance. No tobacco use of any kind is allowed on county owned, maintained or leased property. This entire facility and visible acreage surrounding is county property.
- Election activity is designated for the east end of the building; restroom facilities are available at the back of the parking lot (#4)

Signage

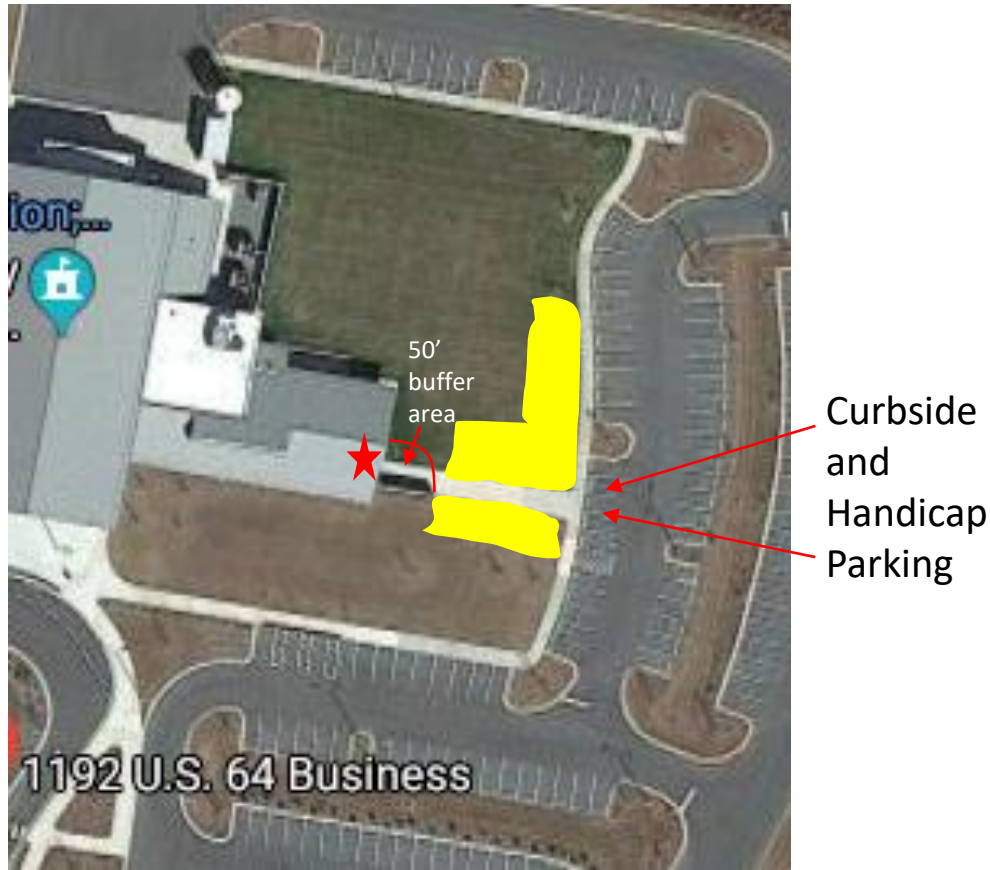
Chatham County government does not generally allow the placement of election signs on county property. However, to comply with election requirements, signs will be allowed near the campaigning/election site entrance.

Areas where signs may be allowed are outlined in yellow on the map to the left.

- Please do not place signs on the approach to the building from US Hwy 64.
- Please do not place signs at the main or west entrance to the building or in the landscaped areas outside of the designated area.

Signs placed in these areas will be collected and returned to the candidate.

Campaign Tents/Activities

- Tents are welcome in the area highlighted in yellow to the left.
- The 50 foot buffer area begins at the end of the wall that juts out from the east end of the building.
- **Curbside voting and handicap parking is labeled to the left-please do not impede those that need assistance the ability to park in those designated spaces.**
- Tents may not be left overnight. Weather is unpredictable and wind can cause tents to become projectiles and potentially cause damage to property, equipment and vehicles.
